### **Evidence of Success**

These exhibitions held in 2017-18 were the outcome of consistent efforts of the teachers and students that served as Best Practices to promote environmental awareness. The students actively prepared models for Organic fertilizer through bio waste, Energy Resources, Types of plants, Soil Conservation through micro-organism, medicinal plants, etc. which helped them to understand environmental issues intimately and developed their interest in environmental studies. One of the major successes of these activities was the consensus among students to avoid the use of plastic.

### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

Student found it difficult to convince the masses about ill-effects of pollution especially growing air water and sound pollutions in city and the measures to be taken. Reluctance of the people was a major hurdle in creating awareness among the people.

More space and resources for conducting research and developing models required for better outcome of the practices. Teacher and students also conduct the survey of plants in our campus and find out some medicinal plants.

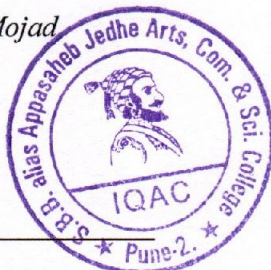
